Isolated wind thunderstorm / rain of Light to Moderate intensity is expected over the upper catchments of all the Major Rivers along with Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Gilgit Baltistan, Kashmir, Punjab, Coastal and Northeast Balochistan & Sindh. Last 24 hours significant rainfall recorded is attached as **Annex B**.
- 8. <u>Weather Advisory / Press Release</u>. Met office has informed on 17 July 2020 that scattered to widespread wind thunderstorm / rain with Heavy falls at isolated places and Very heavy falls at few places is expected over the upper catchments of Rivers Chenab, Ravi & Sutlej along with Gujranwala, Lahore, Sargodha, Sahiwal, Faisalabad, Bahawalpur, D.
